

contract even if West has the ace. To protect himself against this contingency, declarer first cashes the ace of hearts and queen of spades. He then plays the K-Q-A of clubs, followed by dummy's ten of hearts. But instead of ruffing the ten, South

West takes the ten with the jack but unhappily has no safe exit card. He must either lead a diamond or hand declarer a ruffand-discard, and whichever he chooses, South makes four spades.
