This recipe jazzes up an all-time favorite by combining the flavors of three different kinds of beans before baking. It creates a good source of dietary fiber and protein by itself, but also makes a great side dish for hamburgers. explained MANHATTAN — NEXRAD or Doppler radar are terms frequently

heard on weather reports, but have you wondered what they mean? "Both refer to newer (or next gen-

eration) radar that is capable of measuring both precipitation and wind," said Mary Knapp, climatologist for the State of Kansas. "Radar emits a short pulse of energy. If that energy hits an object (such as rain, bugs, or dust), the energy is scattered. A small portion is directed back to the radar.'

Computers then analyze the return signal for strength, the time it took to return and the frequency shift of the signal, said Knapp who heads the state's Weather Data Library at Kansas State University.

This frequency shift changes based on the motion of the object the radar energy hit, and is known as the "Doppler Effect". It was named after the Austrian physicist, Christian Doppler, who discovered it.






