

Kollo's shot wins game for Trojans

With the season winding down and teams jockeying for position as tournament time approaches, Colby Lady Trojans won 48-46 at Barton County Wednesday.

The Lady Cougars led 46-45 when Colby's Rita Kollo scored from inside the lane with seven seconds left. Kollo, the league's leading scorer, notched a game-high 16 points.

Barton County's attempt to regain the lead was unsuccessful, as Maya Onikute turned the ball over bringing it up the court.

The Lady Cougars had grabbed the one-point lead just seconds before Kollo's shot, when Andrea Barber found Victoria Carlile streaking for a lay-up from halfway across the court.

Carlile led Barton County with 15 points, its only player to score in double-figures. She hit seven of 15 shots from the field, and finished second on the team with seven rebounds.

The Lady Cougars led 30-22 at halftime, but were outscored 26-16 in the second half. Barton County's scoring woes correlated to its shooting percentage, as the Lady Cougars connected on just 24-percent of their shots from the field in the second half.

The Lady Cougars grabbed an early lead, with a Barber threepointer giving Barton County a 7-2 lead four minutes in. Colby climbed back into it behind the long-distance shooting of Suzana Sormaz.

Sormaz knocked down two shots

Information courtesy of Great from behind the three-point arc early, helping the Lady Trojans pull back to within a point of the Lady Cougar lead, 11-10.

Sormaz scored 15 points for Colby, hitting five three-pointers on the night.

Barton County responded with a 9-4 run. Carlile and Stephanie N'Garsanet combined for seven of the Lady Cougars' nine points during the run.Barton County controlled the boards in the first half, outrebounding the Lady Trojans 20-15, and scoring eight secondchance points to Colby's zero.

The Lady Cougars scored 14 first-half points in the paint, limiting the Lady Trojans to just four.Barton County's defense keyed their 30-22 halftime edge. The Lady Cougars forced 13 turnovers and limited the Lady Trojans to 38-percent shooting in the opening half.

The Lady Trojans opened the second half fighting back and pulling within two points, 36-34, after a Kollo three-pointer. Kollo's trey came on the heels of a 12-6 Colby run.

The Lady Trojans grabbed their first lead of the contest on a Sormaz three-pointer with nine minutes left. It was her second straight trey for Colby, and the final bucket in an 8-2 run.

Defense was the story of the ensuing seven minutes, with neither team scoring from the field until Kollo put in a lay-up with 1:15 left. Colby (23-3, 11-1) plays Hutchinson 6 p.m. Wednesday at the Colby Community Building.


