After a 10-point victory at Barton Lady Cougars Saturday the Lady Trojans ensured themselves of a game against the eight place team from the Eastern Division, Kansas City Community College.

The win over Barton was highlighted by Shareka Purnell's 20 points. With Colby only leading by three at halftime Purnell went 7-10 from the floor and mixed in a threepointer. Suzana Sormaz helped out with 14 of her own. Kansas City Community Col-

lege wrapped up their season by going 3-15 in conference play and 9-21 overall. They struggled most of the year to score points by only averaging 54.2 on the season. Compare that with No. 7 Colby's 77.9 points per game. Only one of the Lindsey

Newpher averages more than 10 jans finished the season on a 14 points per game with 10.6. She is a game winning streak.

5'10" freshman guard from Depew, Okla. Their other guard Katrena Richard is their outside shot threat. She has 205 three-point attempts on the year but is only shooting at a 24 percent rate from that range.

The Blue Devils do have an inside defensive threat with 6'3" Mara Hoefer. The sophomore has 23 blocks on the year.

The Trojans finished first in the Western Division of the Jayhawk by going 15-1 in conference and 27-3 overall. They are currently ranked seventh in the country. Their 77.9 points per game is the highest in the Jayhawk.

By only allowing 55.2 points per game they have the third best defense in the entire Conference.

Last season's MVP Rita Kollo leads the offense with 21.1 points per game followed by the best threepoint shooter in the Conference Suzana Sormaz with 14.7. The Tro-

The Bulldogs, seeded No. 4, take on the Panthers of Centralia High at 4:45 p.m. Brewster is 24-1 heading into today's action. The Panthers, seeded No. 5, are 22-3 after they defeated Blue Valley High of Randolph 54-26 Saturday in the substate final in Holton.

Leading the Brewster boys in scoring against Natoma was freshman Jeff Reid with 29 points. Sophomore Jance McKee scored 26 and senior Jonathan Collett had 10 points. Sophomore Michael Collett added seven points, and seniors Karman Selby and Kyle O'Connor both scored four. Senior Branson Gilley and freshman Tyler O'Connor both had two points.

The Brewster High School boys top seed with a 25-0 record. South last year by lost to Wetmore by one Gray High of Montezuma is seeded No. 2 and also is 25-0 for the season. Macksville, which finished third in the state last year, is the No. 3 seed also at 25-0.

Should the Bulldogs defeat Centralia, they will face the winner of the Lebo-Claflin game at 4:45 p.m. Thursday at Gross Memorial Coliseum in Hays. Brewster and Centralia both advanced to the state championships last year with each losing in the first round.

Control Russian Aphids, Greenbugs in Winter Wheat

The Russian wheat aphid has been a pest of the Southern and High Plains for the past 20 years. But while losses to this pest have been lower in the past decade, they have the ability to inflict substantial losses, particularly in the

Aphids prefer to feed on the newest growth of the wheat plant – within rolled-up leaves. Heavily infested plants may appear flattened, with young tillers lying nearly parallel to the ground. If not controlled in the

fall when thresholds call for treatment, greenbugs can overwinter and rapidly develop into damaging infestations during warm periods in February and March.

Damage from greenbugs first appears as reddish spots on leaves. Then infested leaves turn yellow to reddish-brown before
