Colby Community College's men's basketball team has had dissapointment this season.

Coley blocked a shot on Colby's next possession, and his free throw with 12.6 seconds left forced the Trojans to take a desperation three-point attempt to try to send the game into overtime.

In the first half the Trojans took a 29-22 lead. The low score was a combination of poor shooting by the Trojans and good defense from both teams. Colby was 2-9 from three point range and 11-29 from the floor. Dodge City was even worse going 9-33 from the floor.

In the second half, the Trojans did all they could to clamp down on the Conquistadors. They limited top scorer Wade Knapp to 10 points. Little used Charlie Coley was the difference on the night.
