# Dry spell worries many

WICHITA (AP) — Farm ponds that are used to water livestock at the Woodston farm of Jerry Mc-Reynolds are so dry this spring he is taking the opportunity to clean silt from their bottom.

Many farmers in north-central Kansas are doing the same thing this spring, he said.

"We have been in this dry cycle for six years," McReynolds said. "For the last three years, we have been able to drive through all of our ponds - sad, but true.'

Stock water supplies across the state were rated as 36 percent short to very short this week by the Kansas Agricultural Statistics Service.

But the lack of water for his cattle herd is not even at the top of Mc-Reynold's list of worries as grazing season nears: "You can haul water, but you can't haul grass.
