Missouri sextuplets never existed

GRAIN VALLEY, Mo. (AP) — The big lie about six little miracles makes for great tabloid TV.

But the city administrator of this small suburb on the fringes of the Kansas City area said the worldwide interest in the scandal of a couple who faked the birth of sextuplets misses an important point.

"This isn't an 'Americans behaving badly' story," City Administrator Gary Bradley said Thursday. "This is a story about a vigilant police department stopping a crime 24 hours after it started."

Police sent their reports to prosecutors on Thursday for possible criminal charges against Kris and Sarah Everson of Grain Valley. Van Buckley, a spokeswoman for Jackson County Prosecutor Mike Sanders, said he did not expect an announcement of any charges until Friday at the earliest.

"It's my understanding that police are still taking statements from Everson quit or was fired. victims," Buckley said.

Sebelius signs cable T

TOPEKA (AP) — State and industry officials said Thursday that a new law governing cable television franchises will mean more services, more choices and lower costs to consumers.

The law, sought by telecommunications giant AT&T, changes the way companies are granted rights to provide services. The law allows companies to sign statewide franchise agreements rather than negotiating deals with each city where they want to provide service.

Supporters said that change will allow for greater competition to traditional cable television providers by new technologies, such as providing voice and data over the

"The goal is to expand competition and lower prices for consumers," Gov. Kathleen Sebelius

David Kerr, AT&T's Kansas president, said the company hopes to offer video service, using fiberoptic cable and phone lines, to half its customers nationwide. But he said a big barrier is having to sign franchise agreements with thousands of individual cities, including more than 600 in Kansas.

The law, patterned after one in Texas, permits new video service providers to obtain a certificate to operate statewide from the secretary of state's office. Instead of paying franchise fees to cities, a company would pay a 5 percent gross receipts tax, with the money going to local governments.

The law would allow cable companies to go through the same process — after their current agreement with a city expires.


