Colby High School's baseball team showed balance in its double-header sweep of Goodland Thursday in Colby.

Trent Powell gave up two hits in seven innings as Colby won game one 9-1. Goodland's lone score was not an earned run.

Colby used 12 hits to score its

nine runs. Four players each had two hits, Mitchell Gatz, Jeremy Dietz, Kevin Lang and Heath Bieker. Gatz and Lang each had two RBIs.

Jury investigates Bonds, perjury

SAN FRANCISCO (AP) — Barry Bonds could be facing bigger problems than baseball's probe into his alleged past steroid use.

A federal grand jury is investigating whether Bonds committed perjury when he testified in 2003 that he never used steroids, a person with knowledge of the probe told The Associated Press on Thursday night.

The person spoke on condition of anonymity because of the secrecy of the investigation.

The panel has been hearing evidence for more than a month about whether Bonds lied to a different grand jury than the one investigating the BALCO scandal. The existence of the grand jury was first reported by CNN on Thursday.

Luke Macaulay, spokesman for

the U.S. Attorney's Office in San Francisco, told the AP that he could neither confirm nor deny the reports.

Bonds was granted immunity when he testified before the BALCO grand jury in December 2003, as long as he told the truth. According to excerpts of the testimony previously reported by the San Francisco Chronicle, Bonds testified that he used a clear substance and a cream given to him by a trainer who later pleaded guilty in a steroid-distribution ring, but said he didn't know they were steroids.

Bonds told the grand jury that Greg Anderson, his personal trainer, told him the substances he used were the nutritional supplement flaxseed oil and a rubbing balm for arthritis.

The substances Bonds described were similar to ones known as "the clear" and "the cream," two steroids at the center of the Bay Area Laboratory Co-Operative scandal. Investigators seized calendars that recorded schedules for Bonds' use of those drugs, as well as human growth hormone, clomid, insulin and other steroids, according to the Chronicle.

Bonds, who has always denied using steroids, left the San Francisco Giants ballpark Thursday night without answering questions about the report from reporters.

Colby RC club begins season

The Colby RC club held its season opening race at Southwind RC Raceway on Sunday, April 9. The race was originally scheduled for April 2 but due to the high winds, the race was postponed. Several members of the Burlington, Colo., club Dirtworks joined in the racing action.

The races are run in five minute heat races and 15 minute mains. The first heat race of the afternoon were the 1/10 scale 2WD stadium trucks. The race was won by Chris Ross from Burlington with nine laps in 5:35.136 seconds, followed by Kent Higerd from Colby, JD Eden from Burlington and Bryan Higerd from Colby in fourth.

Next up were two heats of the 1/8 scale 4WD buggies. In heat one, Justin McClung from Hays took the win with 10 laps in a time of 5:17.301 followed by JD Eden in second, Bill Parsons from Burlington, Blake Arnberger from Colby, Darren Andrews from Colby and Justin Wolf from Colby.

Heat two saw Breck Arnberger from Colby take the win with nine laps in 5:21.409 followed by Chris Ross, Lonnie Drescher from Burlington, Mark Byarlay from Burlington, Brian Downing from Colby, Vern Drescher from Burlington and George Tubbs.

This year will see the start of a new class for the Colby RC club, 1/10 scale winged sprint cars. Bryan and Kent Higerd, Darren Andrews and Breck Arnberger brought cars for this race. Since this is a new class, only one heat was run as shakedown for the cars. Kent Higerd finished the race with 26 laps in just over five minutes.

The next two rounds of heat rac-

ing in the 1/10 scale trucks saw Chris Ross winning the second round and Kent Higerd winning in the third round. The 1/8 scale buggies saw Justin McClung and Breck Arnberger winning both rounds in their respective heats. The mains started with the B-main for the 1/8 scale buggies. mark Byarlay won the 10-minute race with Lonnie Drescher finishing in second. Both advanced to the A-main.

Next up was the 15-minute A-main for the 1/10 scale trucks. JD Eden took ht lead on the first lap only to pit for quick engine adjustments handing the lead over to Kent Higerd. Chriss Ross fell out of the race on lap seven with mechanical problems. Kent Higerd continued to lead and pitted on lap 12 for fuel. On lap 15, Eden passed Higerd for the lead but pitted on the next lap turning the lead back to Higerd who continued to hold the lead until lap 19 when he suffered a minor breakage requiring a lengthy pit stop for repairs. After a minute in the pits, Higerd reentered the race but was a lap down to Eden. JD Eden went on to win the race with 24 laps in just over 15 minutes. Kent Higerd finished in second and Chris Ross was credited with third.

The A-main in the 1/8 scale buggy class featured the meeting of the two winners from the qualifiers, Justin McClung and Breck

Arnberger. The race started with a full field of eight buggies. After the first lap, Mark Byarlay led with McClung hot on his heels less than .2 seconds back. Breck Arnberger had a slower start and was in sixth place after the first lap. McClung took the lead on lap two while Arnberger started working his way through the field. Arnberger moved into second place on lap 10 only to find himself already a lap down to McClung.

McClung went on to dominate the race putting the whole field another lap down on lap 16. Justin McClung won the race with 28 laps in 15:24.764. Breck Arnberger finished second with 26 laps followed by Bill Parsons, Mark Byarlay, Blake Arnberger, Chriss Ross, Lonnie Drescher and JD Eden fell out on lap six and was credited with eighth.

The next race at Southwind RC Raceway will be noon April 23 and is the first race of the Kansas-Colo-rado 3 Track Series. The 3 Track Series is a touring series of the following tracks: Southwind RC in Colby, Dirtworks in Burlington and Rat Raceway in Denver, Colo. All tracks are visited twice during the season with the final race in Denver Sept. 24. The three classes ran in the series are, 1/10 scale 2WD stadium trucks, 1/8 scale 4WD buggy and 1/10 scale 4WD monster trucks.

DURHAM, N.C. (AP) — A police recording obtained by The Associated Press indicates one of the first police officers to see a woman the night she claims she was raped by members of Duke University's lacrosse team described her as "just passed-out drunk."

The taped conversation, which took place about 1:30 a.m. March 14, occurred about five minutes after a grocery store security guard called 911 to report a woman in the parking lot who would not get out of someone else's car.

The recording was released a day before Duke was to host a meeting with black community leaders to discuss the case.

The black woman, a 27-year-old stripper and student at North Carolina Central University in Durham, told police she was raped and beaten by three white men around midnight at an off-campus party thrown by Duke's lacrosse team.

CLEVELAND (AP) — New York Knicks coach Larry Brown was to be hospitalized overnight after becoming ill in the third quarter a game against the Cavaliers.

The 65-year-old Brown, whose had health issues in recent years, was taken from Quicken Loans Arena on a stretcher following New York's 91-87 loss. He appeared alert and was sitting upright with oxygen tubes in his nose as he was wheeled out to an emergency vehicle.
