

Pratt throws a no hitter at Trojans

Pratt swept Colby Tuesday in a low-scoring doubleheader Monday at Pratt.

Pratt won game one 2-0 wit the help of a no-hitter.

The Trojans got one of their best starts of the year from sophomore T.R. Keating (4-5, 2.98) but squandered as Colby was no-hit by Pratt starter Manuel Ruiz.

Keating went six innings and allowed one run on seven hits, one walk and six strike outs. Keating now leads all Colby pitchers with 51.7 innings pitched this year.

Ruiz frustrated Trojan hitters with a fastball, change-up combo that featured pitches that rarely touched 80 mph. A 20 mph wind blowing straight in from center affected hits to the outfield. The Trojans failed to make an adjustment at the plate by recording 13 fly ball

Pratt won game two 2-1.

Colby managed to get their first hit of the day in the first inning but the scoring drought continued.

Freshman Josh Turner appeared to be back to form as he threw six innings and allowed two runs in a losing effort. Trojan batters scattered nine hits but did not manage to score until a Jason Chatwood double in the top of the seventh inning

Second baseman Jason Chatwood is making a strong bid for freshman of the season hitting .371 with 14 doubles, one triple, five homeruns and 27 RBI's. His fielding .968 at second base. Chatwood has not missed a game this season. The Trojans are 14-10 in confer-

ence and sit in third place with eight games remaining in the season.

Colby played Cloud County today. Barton County visits Colby 1 p.m. Thursday. The Trojans have a chance to finish as high as second place and as low as seventh depending on the games this week.
