Sports Briefs

PHOENIX (AP) — Pitcher Jason Grimsley was released by the Arizona Diamondbacks, a day after his home was searched by federal agents following his admission he used human growth hormone, steroids and amphetamines.

The raid — and Grimsley's implication of other major league ballplayers — was the latest sign that widespread investigations into drug use by athletes are still active, even in the era of tougher testing.

Joe Bick, Grimsley's agent, told The Associated Press he thought this would mark the end of the 38-year-old reliever's career.

Diamondbacks general manager Josh Byrnes said Grimsley asked for his unconditional release in meetings with team officials.

SAN FRANCISCO (AP) — Barry Bonds tweaked his left side during last weekend's series in New York, though the San Francisco slugger initially tried to play through it.

The injury has become worse in recent days, and Bonds grimaced after a swing during Tuesday night's 2-1 win over the Florida Marlins.

His status for a four-game series against his former club — the Pittsburgh Pirates — starting Thursday night was in question.

PRO FOOTBALL
NASHVILLE, Tenn. (AP) — Steve McNair finally split with the Tennessee Titans and is heading for Baltimore.

McNair, who led the Titans to the 2000 Super Bowl, was finally dealt to a team that has been seeking a prime quarterback. He still had to pass a physical to finalize the deal, but the Ravens planned to introduce McNair at a news conference Thursday.

The Titans received what is believed to be a fourth-round pick in next spring's draft.

The 33-year-old McNair was the winningest quarterback in franchise history. In 11 seasons, he went 81-59 and shared the MVP award with Peyton Manning in 2003.

The quarterback won a grievance last week that allowed him to return to the team's headquarters and work out after being told he couldn't on April 3.
