Kansas millstone earns Panera Bread contract

NEW CAMBRIA (AP) -Mill has landed a contract to supply Panera Bread with flour for its whole grain breads.

Panera, which has 900 bakerycafes across the country, buys a advantages of food made with "significant amount" of its wholegrain flour from Farmer Direct, said spokeswoman Julie Sommers. Homestead Mill, one of a handful of authentic stoneground mills in the country, has three giant redgranite millstones that can each grind about 1,200 pounds of whole-wheat flour every hour during a typical 10- to 18-hour

day. The flour is dumped into 40pound bags, which are automatically weighed and sealed before moving down a conveyor belt to be compacted and loaded onto shipping pallets.

"When we really get rolling, we can load a semi in an afternoon," said Kent Symns, president of Farmer Direct Foods, an Atchisonbased closed cooperative of whitewheat growers that owns the mill at New Cambria, a town about seven miles east of Salina.

"This kind of milling is something of an art," Symns said. "It takes a lot of monitoring and setting and re-setting.'

Farmer Direct flour is an ingredient in Panera's whole-grain, country, rye, three-seed and honey-wheat breads.

"We've been really happy with petitive," Symns said.

our relationship with Farmer Di-Farmer Direct Foods Homestead rect," Sommers said. "One of the great things about the organization is the passion for providing a quality product."

Recent studies touting the health whole grains has helped demand for white wheat flour, which produces a soft, sweet whole-grain bread.

"One of the things a lot of people don't like about whole-wheat bread made with hard red wheat is the coarse texture and bitter taste that come from the red bran," Symns said. "White wheat does not have the tannins that give red

wheat that color." But higher demand also has a downside.

Over the past decade, that has been sufficient production — an effort that is expected to be further hampered as farmers face higher expenses to grow white wheat without higher prices when they sell it.

For the first three years of a major U.S. Department of Agriculture push for white wheat, a government program offered an incentive bonus to white-wheat growers and a per-acre subsidy to help pay for the higher cost of certified white wheat seed.

Those payments went away last year. And acres of white wheat overall have gone down.
