Lawrence plans Civil War events

The 11th annual Civil War on the Western Frontier event will be held Aug. 10-21 in Lawrence.

Susan Henderson, marketing director with the Lawrence Convention and Visitors Bureau, said the event commemorates the city's history between 1854-1865.

Programs will include dramatic performances, scholarly lectures, living history and re-enactments.

The events center on the anniversary of Quantrell's Raid. The morn-

ing of Aug. 21, 1863, William Quantrill and pro-confederate guerrillas stormed the city, leaving behind nearly 200 victims and \$1.5 million in damages.

"Each year, Lawrence remembers the victims and recognizes the survivor's spirit of the city," Henderson said.

The event includes a "Quantrill's Raid Walking Tour" that traces the path of the raid and the events surrounding it, a Civil War Union cav-

alry camp and a Confederate artillery camp.

There will also be children's workshops that teaches them about the history of mud forts in Lawrence. Other activities include live performances of "The Ballad of Black Jack," a musical that deals with pro- and anti-slavery issues of the time.
