Colby man sentenced for selling drugs

A Colby man is going to prison for nearly three years for selling drugs near a preschool.

Michael T. Beedy, 33, was convicted of selling drugs in the 700 block of West Eighth Street July 6, 2005. Beedy's residence is two blocks from Puddle Duck Preschool.

Beedy was charged with one count each of sale of a narcotic within 1,000 feet of school property and possession of drug parapherna-

On July 27, District Judge Glenn Schiffner sentenced Beedy to 30 months in prison and another 36 months probation after he gets out of prison. Beedy was also ordered to pay \$952 in court costs and Kansas Bureau of Investigation lab fees.

According to the Kansas Department of Corrections, this is not Beedy, s first time in prison. He served time for selling drugs in Sherman County in 2002, and selling drugs in Thomas County that same year. Beedy was released from prison on Aug. 11, 2003, before being arrested on these latest
