The rural communities featured in this year's tour highlight how drought and lower farm incomes have prompted rural communities to search for alternative sources of revenue, including agritourism and grants for rural business opportunities. KFB members who live in these small towns will also discuss the costs of rural education and their concern about the use of local property taxes to fund schools.

Debit card does not act like a credit card

Dear Attorney General Kline: I have been receiving information from my bank promoting a debit card, stating that the card is accepted nearly anywhere major credit cards are accepted. How does a credit card differ from a debit card?

Dear Kansas Consumer:

Even though debit cards closely resemble credit cards and are widely accepted at many locations that accept credit cards, you should understand how they operate differ-

When a debit card is used the availability of funds is verified immediately and that amount is deducted from your checking or savings account. Credit cards on the other hand are "pay later" products which offer a line of credit and grace periods you can borrow against for purchases. Simply put, debit cards provide

the advantage of allowing you to spend only what money you have saved and deposited into your ac-Before you begin using your debit card, you should fully under-

stand the conditions and terms governing your card. Some debit cards have fees for each transaction, some have monthly fees and some may have both.

close the amount and the types of fees charged for using the card. Many times this disclosure of fees is located in the fine print of the application form, so be sure you read that fine print very carefully.

Debit cards are usually protected by a personal identification number, or PIN. You should consider the PIN the key to your account because the debit card cannot be used without it. If you are allowed to choose your own PIN, it's a good idea to be creative when selecting one. Random numbers are considered the best instead of using birthdates or addresses. It is vital that you closely guard your card and the PIN because if someone were to gain access to them both, your account could be emptied. Do not carry your PIN in written form near your card, memorize it instead.

Here are a few tips on using your debit card:


