The Trojan volleyball team swept McCook Community College in three games Wednesday at McCook, T.

They won by the scores of 30-23, 30-28, 30-15.

"We are beginning to show the capability we possess," coach Pedro Gonzalez said. "The assistant coaches and I are finally seeing the results from our hard work. There are still areas we need to work on, but overall I'm glad with the win."

Ana Kokanovic led Colby with 23 kills.

Trojans to host meet

Colby Community College's men's and women's cross country teams will host the Colby Invitational 7 p.m. Friday on campus.

The competition will be the second of the season for both squads. Both the men and the women placed third in Great Bend on Aug. 25.

The meet will feature Colby, Oklahoma Panhandle State University, Colorado Northwest Community College and Barton County Community College.

The Colby men's squad is currently ranked 14th in the first NJCAA poll. The men's poll also features nine other members of the Jayhawk West and East conferences. Trojan women are ranked 8th in the first NJCAA poll.

NFL studies drugs

EAST RUTHERFORD, N.J. (AP) — The NFL and its union are discussing strengthening their drug program to keep pace with the increase in the number of performance-enhancing substances and the efficiency of masking agents.

Commissioner Roger Goodell, in his first news conference since taking over for Paul Tagliabue last Friday, said he has been discussing the problem with Gene Upshaw, the head of the NFL Players Association. Among the topics discussed were increasing the number of tests and perhaps the number of substances tested.

But Goodell, who has been the NFL's chief operating officer the past six years, noted that the review is nothing new: The union and the league review the drug testing program annually. The NFL currently makes approximately 10,000 random tests annually for performance-enhancing drugs to about 2,000 players.
