Monument man sentenced in cattle theft case

A Monument man charged with cattle theft was sentenced in Logan County District Court last week.

Michael T. Coberly, 24, was sentenced to an underlying prison term of six months and placed on 12 months supervised probation for cattle theft.

Coberly was charged with having stolen two cows, two heifer calves

and four bulls from Dave Hubert, owner of Pure Breed Charolais on or about May 25.

In July, Coberly pleaded plea of no contest, the same effect as a guilty plea.

Schiffner ordered Coberly to pay \$5,032 in court costs and restitution for the incident.

Schiffner told Coberly being convicted of a felony means he can not own a firearm for five years and must submit blood and saliva

samples to the Kansas Bureau of Investigation within 10 days.

After the cattle were reported missing, livestock auctions in Colby and Russell were contacted to look for ear tags matching those on the missing cattle.

When the ear tags were located, Coberly and his wife, Jackie Ann Coberly, were arrested.

Charges in Logan County filed against Jackie Ann Coberly were dismissed.

The Coberly's were also suspected of stealing cattle from a Gove County resident May 11 and Scott County resident May 15.

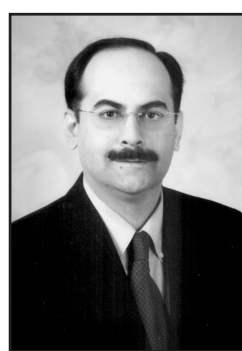
According to a spokesman for Gove County District Court, Michael Coberly has been charged with theft and criminal trespass. He is scheduled for court in Gove Oct. 3.

Scott County District Court, Michael Coberly has charged with felony theft of cattle for having allegedly taken eight cattle from Beef Belt Feeders.

He is scheduled for a preliminary hearing Sept. 21 in Scott City.

Jackie Coberly was not charged in Gove County or Scott County in connection with the alleged crimes against her husband.

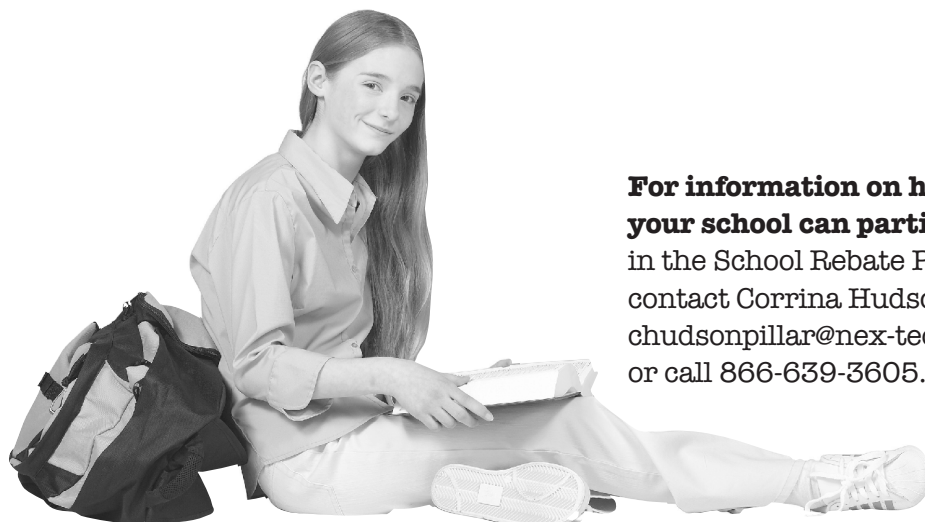
