Legendary coach to speak at Colby college

From Colby Community College

Colby Community College wrestling team and head coach Steve Lampe announced Dan Gable, Olympic gold medalist in wrestling and 15-time national champion coach, will speak at the annual wrestling banquet Tuesday, Oct. 17.

In 1972, Gable captured the gold medal at the Summer Olympics without surrendering a single point to any opponent. In Gable's final 21 Olympic matches, he registered 12 falls and outscored the remaining nine opponents, 130-1.

Gable joined the University of Iowa coaching staff in 1972 as an assistant coach and took over the program in 1977. He remained as head coach until 1997. In that span, Gable captured 15 national championships, nine of them were consecutive, compiled a career record of 355-21-5, coached 152 All-Americans, and 45 national champions.

The Hawkeyes won 25 consecutive Big Ten Championships, 21 with Gable as the coach.

Last year, Gable returned to Iowa wrestling as an assistant coach un-

der head coach Tom Brands. Gable coached Brands to three NCAA titles during his Hawkeye career. Brands also served as an assistant coach at Iowa for five seasons under Gable (1993-97).

Gable is considered one of wrestling's most prominent figures and spokesman. During his prep and collegiate career, Gable compiled an outstanding 118-1 record, with his only defeat coming in the NCAA finals of his senior year.

Gable was named to the U.S.A. Wrestling Hall of Fame in 1980, and to the U.S. Olympic Hall of Fame in 1985. He was selected the nation's outstanding wrestler by the AAU in 1970, and the U.S. Wrestling Federation in 1971. Gable was the Amateur Wrestling News Man of the Year in 1970.

JV Eagles beat Quinter

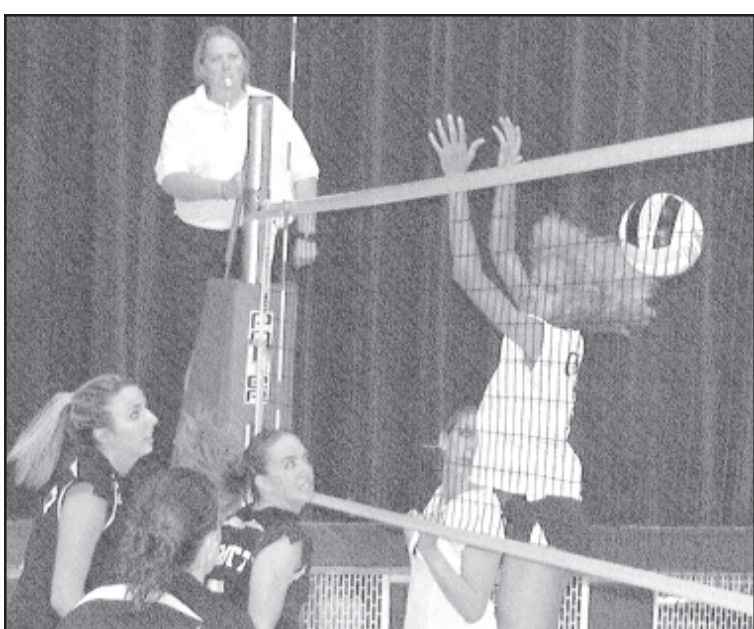
Colby Eagle junior varsity football team defeated Quinter 21-13 Monday in Colby.
