Brewster’s volleyball team still does not know what it feels like to lose.

The team extended its winning streak to 18 matches after winning three more Tuesday at its own quad meet.

Brewster defeated Triplains 25-21, 25-11; Greeley County 25-13, 25-12 and Sharon Springs 23-25, 25-19, 25-21.

Brewster coach Lynda McKee said her team was able to get by its struggles for the wins.

The team placed third with 71 points at the Hays meet Thursday, and coach Bob Mannebach likes how the team is developing.

“Their times continue to drop with each meet,” he said. “Josh Baden and Darren Sporing had a great run and both earned a medal.”

Baden led Colby placing second in 16:51.

“Josh ran at the front with a runner from Garden City and Abilene the entire race,” Mannebach said.

Sporing finished seventh in 17:46. Kahle Phillips finished 16th in 18:47. Trevor Siebert finished 21st in 19:05 and Ryan Baalman finished Colby’s scoring placing

25th in 19:14.

“Kale has continued to make great improvements during our last meets. Trevor, Ryan, Trenton Powell and Matt Kaus have been very consistent and I believe they will continue to get better during October,” Mannebach said.

Powell placed 31st in 19:36 and Kaus finished 29th in 20:18.

Scott City won the meet with 59 points. Abilene finished second with 61 points. Behind Colby were Hill City, Ness City, Ulysses, Trego County, Ellis and Stockton.

Colby girls did not run at Hays.

Colby runs 10 a.m. Oct. 7 at Lakin.

Stephen Dinkel led Colby’s junior varsity with a 29th place finish in 20:59.

IRVING, Texas (AP) — Police closed the Terrell Owens case, calling it nothing more than an “accidental overdose.” The 911 call that started it all was released, too, revealing little beyond what was already known: that T.O. swallowed “too many pills.”

Each piece of evidence that came to light seemed to square with T.O.’s version of events — that he made a mistake, had a bad reaction and was by no means trying to kill himself.

Owens, meanwhile, was back at practice for the first time since breaking his hand Sept. 17 and might play Sunday in Tennessee.

KANSAS CITY, Mo. (AP) — Quarterback Trent Green said the severe concussion that left him unconscious on Sept. 10 will keep him sidelined at least until after Kansas City’s game Oct. 8 against Arizona.

Speaking with Kansas City reporters for the first time since absorbing the head-snapping hit in the season opener, Green said he’s feeling much better and is finally able to drive, and that he might even join the Chiefs on the sideline Sunday in their game at home against San

Francisco.

ATLANTA (AP) — Pedro Martinez’s injury plagued season came to an end — less than a week short of the playoffs.

The New York Mets learned that their ace is done for the year with a torn tendon in his left calf muscle.

Instead of pitching Game 1 in next week’s NL division series, Martinez will be in the early days of a four- to six-week recovery period. While surgery won’t be necessary, there’s no chance of the three-time Cy Young Award winner pitching again in 2006, even if the Mets make it all the way to the World Series.

Martinez returned to New York after getting knocked around badly in his final start of the regular season Wednesday night, a 13-1 loss to the Braves. An MRI showed a tear in the left calf — different from the right calf injury that recently put him on the disabled list for a month and was thought to be his major concern.

Orlando Hernandez will now start Game 1 in the best-of-five division series.
