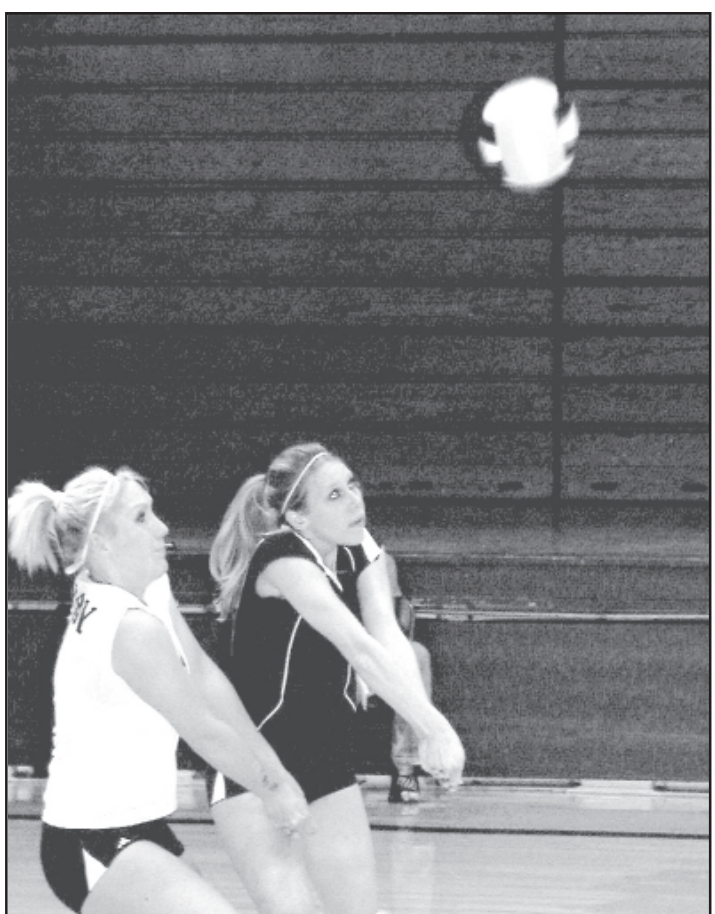

Colby Community College's men's rodeo team finished ninth last weekend in the 9th Annual Colby Community College NIRA Rodeo held at the Thomas County Fairgrounds.

Two-and four-year colleges and universities from Kansas, Oklahoma and Missouri competed in the three-day event.

"I was very impressed with the caliber of students who came to Colby to compete in this Central Plains Region rodeo," said Colby President Dr. Lynn Kreider. "Four-hundred-fourteen students com-

peted in 600 events. Everything went very smoothly. The contestants were polite and extremely patient. Allen Russell and his assistants did a great job organizing this event which brings hundreds of people to our community."

Panhandle State University came in first in the men's competition, followed by Northwestern Oklahoma State, Southwestern Oklahoma State and Garden City Community College.

State University was second followed by Garden City Community College and Fort Hays State University.

In the team roping competition, Benjamin Robinson (Arapahoe, Neb.) finished in second place with his partner Christopher Sherman who competes for Fort Hays State University.

Fort Hays' Brooke Inlow of Oakley tied for first in goat tying. She is a former Colby rodeo team member.

Over 400 college students competed.
