With five freshmen starting for the Wildcats — including quarterback Josh Freeman and two of the offensive linemen charged with protecting him — the Oklahoma State linebacker can be forgiven for finding Saturday's game an appe-

"I'm licking my chops on that one, because it's good to get in there with a true freshman," Johnson said. "You can disguise more, you can fiddle around on defense more, because coming straight out of high school, they're not used to reading coverages.

"We can turn some guys loose and let the D-line get home, like they've been doing all year."

Kansas State (3-2,0-1 Big 12) has been solid on defense in Ron Prince's first season as coach, allowing just 14.2 points per game. But offense is another story.

The Wildcats have managed just three touchdowns in their last three games, and their 20.2-point scoring average — second-lowest in the Big 12 — is skewed upward by defensive and return TDs and a 45-0 blowout of overmatched Florida

They didn't break double digits in either of their last two games, both defeats, and were held out of the end zone entirely in last week's 17-3 loss at Baylor.

Prince responded by dropping running back Thomas Clayton, who lost a fumble deep in the Bears' territory, to the third string and by making Freeman his starter ahead of senior Dylan Meier.

"I think we're having a lot of difficulty having any kind of consistency that puts drives together," Prince said. "There are a number of factors in that. The execution at a number of positions right now isn't where we would like it to be.'


