After passing for barely 50 yards in his return from a 10-week layoff, the two-time Pro Bowl quarterback coolly threw for 50 yards in one game-winning fourth-quarter drive. Hitting three of five in the final minutes, Green set up Larry Johnson's 1-yard go-ahead touchdown run and rallied the sluggish Chiefs past injury-riddled Oakland

17-13. "The majority of games in this league come down to the fourth quarter, and finding ways to get that done," said Green, who couldn't even drive the first couple of weeks after suffering a severe concussion on Sept. 10.

LAWRENCE (AP) — Freshman shoulder. center Darrell Arthur scored 26 points in his first career start, leading No. 3 Kansas to an 87-61 victory over Towson on Sunday night in the first round of the Las Vegas Invitational.

Arthur, who averaged 17 points as a reserve in Kansas' first two games and is now the Jayhawks' leading scorer with a 20-point average, was 10-for-12 from the field and 6-for-7 from the line. His eight rebounds were also a career high.

He started Sunday night because Darnell Jackson, who had six points shoulder that Arthur converted into in limited action, has a sore right a basket for a 73-46 lead.

Mario Chalmers hit three key 3pointers and added 15 points for Kansas (2-1), which was coming off a 78-71 home loss to Oral Roberts on Wednesday.

Brandon Rush had 13 points for the Jayhawks, and Julian Wright scored all but one of his 12 points in the second half.
