## Tickets a bonus for 4-H

MANHATTAN — Holiday moviegoers who choose "Charlotte's Web," a new movie based on the popular children's book with the same name, can help support state 4-H youth development programs by buying their tickets online, said Pat McNally, Kansas 4-H state leader.

In the movie, the character Fern uses her head, heart, hands and health — the basis of 4-H youth development — to encourage family and friends to save Wilbur from the smokehouse, and later enters him in the local 4-

H Fair. The fund-raising tie to support youth development programs is a natural, said McNally, who explained how it works: The National 4-H Council has negotiated a \$1 donation (from a \$2 processing fee) for each movie ticket sold through its Web site: <http://www.fourhcouncil.edu>.

Ticket vouchers can be redeemed at local theaters participating in the program.

Contributions earmarked for state programs will be matched via zip codes to make sure the money goes to the right place.

The program is for Kansas citizens 55 or older. These are kits that contain a medical information form, a self-adhesive bright yellow sticker and a bright yellow envelope. The instructions for using these kits are very simple: fill out

the medical sheet, place the information in the yellow envelope, place the envelope in the glove compartment, and place the adhesive yellow dot on the driver's side back window. The yellow dot signifies that there is medical information stored in the glove compartment. In case of an emergency, first responders and other personnel will have a brief description of medical needs and emergency contacts. Law enforcement, fire departments, EMS/ambulance services and hospitals all over the state have been alerted to watch for the Kansas Yellow Dot. The kits are available at the

Northwest RSVP office in Colby. Laura is asking everyone to spread the word of the availability and importance of getting these kits in citizens' cars.

In other club business, Lion President Hazel Estes presented past president Sheryl Brenn the Excellent Past President Certificate. Lion Mary Hurtt was awarded the District Key Award for Membership Advancement. A sign-up worksheet for the pancake feed Saturday was passed around. ## 'Tuna-cones' new twist on recipe

Here's a new twist on an old favorite. This easy recipe, provided by Kansas State University's Family Nutrition Program, makes 4 servings.

Ingredients:  
1 can (6-ounce) water-pack tuna, drained  
2 hard-cooked eggs, peeled and finely chopped  
1/4 cup sweet pickle relish  
1/2 cup chopped celery  
1/3 cup low fat mayonnaise-type

salad dressing  
4 small ice-cream cones or Bugles® snacks

Directions: 1) Remember to wash your hands.

2) Mix first five ingredients in medium bowl.

3) Stuff mixture in small cones for serving, or in Bugles® snacks for tasting.

Helpful Hints: Tuna salad goes well with whole-wheat crackers if cones are not available.

Safety Tip: Be sure foods are age-appropriate to prevent choking.

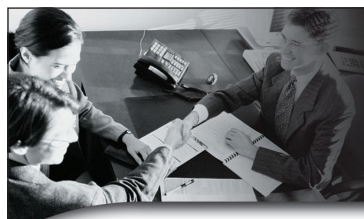
