### Healthy pancakes and easy family fix

Blueberries add color and flavor to these pancakes, which also include such healthful ingredients as whole-wheat flour and yogurt. Kids enjoy watching for the bubbles that signal pancakes are ready to turn over. But, they enjoy eating pancakes even more — plain or lightly buttered and served with syrup or preserves. This "blue-riffic" pancake recipe is from Kansas State University's Family Nutrition Program. With three-inch pancakes, it makes 12 to 14 servings.

Ingredients:

1/2 cup all-purpose flour 1/2 cup whole-wheat flour

1 teaspoon baking powder 1/2 teaspoon baking soda

1 tablespoon vegetable oil

1 cup plain yogurt

1/2 cup soy milk or low fat milk 3/4 cup blueberries

Directions:

1. Wash your hands.

2. In a large mixing bowl, comoine flours, baking powder and bak-

3. In another mixing bowl, mix together oil, egg, yogurt and milk. 4. Add yogurt mixture to flour mixture and stir until just combined.

If blueberries are in season, fresh berries can make a subtle, but nice difference. Still, a package of frozen blueberries from the freezer can always add great color, flavor and nutrition to a pancake meal.

Pancakes aren't just for breakfast. They can be a great last-minute idea for supper.

Safety Tips: Remind kids they always need to wash their hands after handling raw eggs. So, they'll need to stop for a wash after they add an egg to this recipe.

Be sure the skillet's handle is turned toward the center or back of the stove (or, with an electric skil-If batter seems too thick, add 1-2 let, toward the side or back of the
