Law to ban funeral picketing deserves chance

Kansans are all too familiar with the conduct of protesters attending the funerals of fallen soldiers across the nation. In a perfect world, we wouldn't need laws to regulate these individuals. People would practice their free speech at any number of opportunities while still honoring the privacy of families during their time of grief and mourning.

The world is not perfect, however, and laws must be written and tested to protect the safety, privacy and freedom of us all.

As your Attorney General, I pledge to investigate any options constitutionally available to me to protect grieving Kansans from these vile protests.

I testified before the Kansas Legislature last week in support of a bill to establish a 150-foot buffer around churches, funeral homes and cemeteries. Protesters of all types would be prohibited from this area in the hours surrounding a funeral service.

The details of this bill make it different from past attempts to regulate funeral protesters in Kansas. To ensure this bill does not violate free

speech, and to avoid any possibility of paying legal fees to protesters who dispute the bill, my office will be responsible for challenging the constitutionality of the law be-

fore it would take effect. Only the courts can determine whether a law is constitutional, but I believe this legislation has the potential to provide grieving families with the privacy and protection they deserve without compromising our First Amendment rights.

Twenty-six other states and the federal government have already passed laws that prohibit disrespectful intrusions during funerals. Now is the time for Kansas to join these states in protecting our families and pass the best law we can.

That the Governing Body of the Colby Community College shall be authorized to acquire, construct, install and equip (a) a Wellness/ Activity Complex of approximately 115,000 square feet, which will include a 2,400-seat competition gymnasium, a secondary practice gymnasium with spectator seating, wrestling room, eight locker rooms, an elevated walking track, free weights, machine weights, cardio center, coaches' office, all-purpose classroom, large concession area and a vestibule, (b) a 260-bed dormitory and (c) all other necessary improvements appurtenant thereto, at an estimated cost not to exceed \$20,000,000, by entering into a lease purchase agreement and, if advantageous, issues certificates of participation, with the principal amount of such lease purchase agreement to not exceed \$10,510,000 and the expected total of all payments, including interest, under said leased purchase agreement to be approximately \$15,950,000 (excluding amounts required for maintenance, taxes or insurance on the improvements)?
