NFL researches discipline policy

PHOENIX (AP) — NFL commissioner Roger Goodell hopes to hand down disciplinary measures within 10 days of meeting with Tennessee cornerback Adam “Pacman” Jones and Cincinnati receiver Chris Henry.

Goodell’s new, stronger player-conduct policy has not been fully formulated, but he’ll still meet next Tuesday with the two players, who have had numerous run-ins with the law.

“These are part of the hearings I’ve had with a player or coach facing discipline decisions,” Goodell said Wednesday as the league meetings concluded. “It’s to get their perspective, look them in the eye and get them thinking. They are clearly (designed) to give me better info and more facts. I do it frequently.”

It could happen even more often, given the number of off-field incidents that have recently plagued the league.

Jones has talked to police in 10 separate incidents since being drafted in April 2005 and has been arrested five times. On Monday, Las Vegas police recommended prosecutors file a felony charge of coercion and misdemeanor charges of battery and threat against Jones, stemming from a Feb. 19 strip club fight and shooting.

Henry is among nine Bengals players arrested in less than a year. He had four arrests in 14 months, including marijuana possession, a weapon charge and a drunken-driving count that resulted in a guilty plea to reckless operation of a vehicle.

“I won’t lump all of these inci-

dents into a bowl and deal with it,” Goodell said. “I’m not trying to send a signal here and make examples of people. We’ll do what we need to protect the integrity of the NFL. That’s our objective.”

Jones’ attorney, Manny Arora of Atlanta, said they hope the commissioner will wait until the Las Vegas case is resolved before taking action.

If not, Jones is prepared to fight it legally, Arora said, especially if Jones were to receive a one-year suspension.

“It’s going to end up being a big fight. There’ll be injunctions,” Arora said. “The NFL will fight this and that. We’re going to draw it out through the court, and the attention’s going to go through the roof.”

Trojans sweep Dodge City

Conditions weren’t ideal and they didn’t look their best, but the Colby Community College baseball team overcame adversities for a doubleheader sweep over Dodge City Community College Wednesday.

The Trojans won game one 6-5, despite having trouble with the wind and tracking fly balls.

Mike Schmitt earned the win by pitching 5 1/3 innings and striking out eight batters. Schmitt struggled in the early innings, but was able to work out of jams in the first and second inning. Schmitt settled in, but ran into trouble in the sixth inning.

Steve Blankenship ended the threat in the sixth inning and pitched a scoreless seventh inning for the save.

Marshall MacDonald was 2-3 with a double for the Trojans, Brennan Peterson was 1-3 with two RBIs, and Sean Caggiano collected two hits and an RBI.

Colby’s game two starter Josh Turner pounded the strike zone with an assortment of pitches, and allowed no earned runs over six innings. However, five Trojan errors enabled Dodge City to keep the game close. Colby won 7-5.

Steve Hogue pitched 2/3 of an inning and struggled with his control, but Garrett Morgan came on in relief for the save.

Marshall MacDonald had a double and two RBIs. MacDonald’s double would have been a home run on most days, but the wind knocked it down just short of the right field fence.

Chris Eddy and Sean Caggiano also had a double for the Trojans and Jason Chatwood was 2-3 with a walk and two runs scored.

Colby (20-10, 9-5) travels to Butler County (18-5, 9-3) on Saturday for a doubleheader. Butler is the No. 7-ranked team in the NJCAA and leads the Trojans by a game in the Jayhawk West standings.

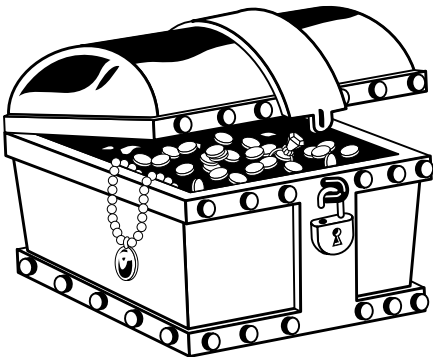

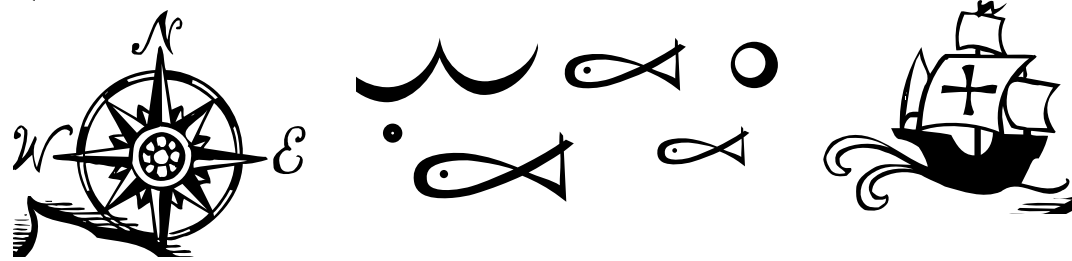
