The Colby Community College baseball team couldn't find its way offensively on Sunday losing a doubleheader to Seward County in Colby.

The Trojan offense combined for one run in two games and just 10 hits overall. The Trojans lost game one 7-0. Outfielder Aaron Dunsmore reached base three

times, collecting a hit, a walk and hit by a pitch. Starting pitcher Josh Turner struggled with his control, allowing five walks in his four innings of work.

The Trojans committed three errors which lead to three unearned runs in the 4-1 loss in game two.

Kris Jiggitts took the loss for the Trojans despite allowing only one

earned run in seven innings. The Trojans only run came in the second inning on a Brennan Peterson single in the second inning which scored Patrick Farrell.

Shockers hire coach

WICHITA (AP) — Wichita State hired Gregg Marshall as its basketball coach Saturday, four weeks after he led Winthrop to a first-round victory over Notre Dame in the NCAA tournament.

Athletic director Jim Schaus said the school had reached a tentative seven-year agreement with Marshall for \$750,000 a year, plus performance incentives. Schaus told reporters Marshall was his first choice to fill the job.

Marshall replaces Mark Turgeon, who left for Texas A&M on Tuesday.

The Colby Community College track and field team competed at the Colorado College Invitational on Saturday.

Head coach Jeff Becker said although he and his team were uncertain about the weather, they decided to go to the meet. As it turned out, Becker said that the weather was great.

Kaitlyn Stapp and Erin Henke turned in solid performances for the Trojans.

Stapp won the high jump with a leap of 4-10 and the height was the 10th best jump all-time in Colby history.

Henke finished first in the javelin with a throw of 107-3.

"This meet is usually a great meet for our sprinters and field event athletes," Becker said. "This year was no exception as we had great performances in those areas."

The Trojans had several runners who had season best performances in their individual events. Those athletes are Amanda Daugherty (100m, 13.41) and (200m, 27.67), Vicari Prospero (200m, 27.09), Loree Siruta (200m, 28.13 and 100m high hurdles, 18.38), Betty Rotich (800m, 2:25.22 and mile, 5:14.61), Mary Nyambura (mile, 6:26.07).

The Trojans will compete at the KU Relays in Lawrence Thursday through Saturday.

LOS ANGELES (AP) — The Dodgers solemnly lined up along the third-base line, each and every one wearing No. 42.

Jackie Robinson broke major league baseball's color barrier on April 15, 1947, with the Brooklyn Dodgers, and the sport celebrated the 60th anniversary of his debut throughout the country Sunday, when more than 200 players, managers and coaches wore his number.

Hank Aaron and Frank Robinson threw out ceremonial first pitches, and fellow Hall of Famers Joe Morgan and Dave Winfield were on hand, joined by actors Courtney B. Vance and Marlon Wayans. Academy Award winner Jennifer Hudson sang "The Star-Spangled Banner."

KANSAS CITY, Mo. (AP) — Kansas City guard Will Shields is retiring after 14 NFL seasons, during which he made a record 12 Pro Bowl appearances and anchored one of the top offensive lines in the league.

Shields, who made a team-record 224 starts, made his 12th Pro Bowl appearance last season to tie the record held by Minnesota guard Randall McDaniel.
