Heights High School of Agra. He is pursuing a degree in pre-vet at Emporia State University.

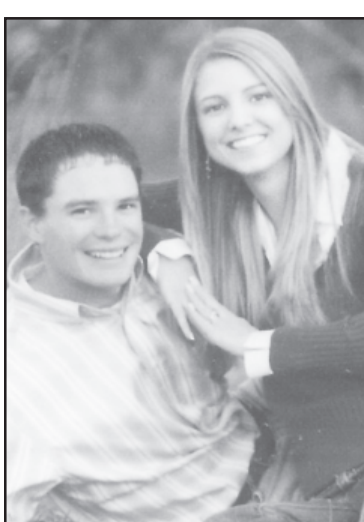

enroute to Colorado to attend a disaster training seminar.

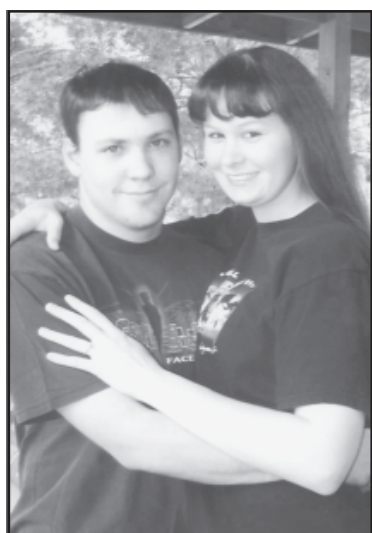

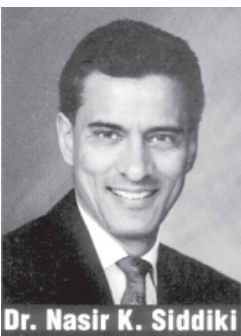
