





The following article taken from information she shared with me is almost identical with the conditions which exist in 2007: TAKEN FROM THE LOGAN COUNTY REPUBLICAN May 3, 1888:

"The fine rains which fell throughout this portion of the state last week have done an incalculable amount of benefit to this county and city. The farmers' waning hopes have revived and congratulations on the crop out-look are the order of

There is no disguising the fact that the dryness was beginning to cause a slight apprehension on the part of the people of north-west Kansas, but last week's deluge has set those fears at rest and has assured the crops of this region. Every draw was running full and the Smoky valley was overflowed it's entire length, so much so that communication between opposite sides

Jean Lowe and Cynthia was completely cut off for several days. The value of farm and city property has advanced and an era of unbounded prosperity lies open before Logan County and Russell Springs, the Pride of the Smoky.'

Much of the above is applicable today, but don't we wish the Smoky were running full!
