As a team, Colby's score was not good enough for a trip to state.

Haas, 15, said he has been playing golf ever since he was 2. He said this year he had to develop his game to learn how to play competitive, high school golf. Part of those skills is again learning how frustrating

"At Hoxie I shot a 70 and at McCook I shot an 87," he said. Those meets were two weeks apart.

"There is a mental challenge with golf," he said. "And you will have days when nothing goes right."

Haas thanks coach Tom Bowen for his success.

"He's been great. He's a great coach and has helped a lot. He is a very good asset," Haas said.

Bowen, who has coached Colby

golf for 10 years, said this will be different for him because while he has coached he has never sent only a freshman to the state meet.

"He's played in good golf tournaments through junior golf," Bowen said. "I don't feel he will be intimi-

Bowen said what will be a challenge for Haas is he has nobody to

"It's different without your team and the moral support," he said.

But at the same time, Bowen said this is a major step in Haas' high school golf career.

"You hope you can learn and draw from these experiences. There will be some real good golfers there," Bowen said. What Haas does this year provides a foundation for his future.

"This may be easier than being a junior or senior," Bowen said. "Because you have three years left to improve."

Haas was the only Colby golfer to qualify. He tees off at 9:40 a.m. at the Wamego Country Club.


