Judge considers letting lawyers go from case

TOPEKA, Kan. (AP) — Attorneys for a former Westar Energy Inc. executive charged with looting the utility asked a federal judge Tuesday to be allowed to withdraw from the case, saying they haven't been paid in years.  
Edward Little, lead defense attorney for former chief strategy officer Douglas Lake, said his law firm and another firm helping out with Lake's defense are owed almost \$3.3 million for a past trial and appeals.  
Lake and David Wittig, Westar's former chief executive, are scheduled for trial in January on charges that include conspiracy and circumvention of internal controls.  
Asking the firms to represent Lake essentially for free at that trial, estimated to cost up to \$3 million more, is an "unreasonable financial burden," Little told U.S. District Judge Julie Robinson.  
"I would love to come out here and try a third case; I believe in Mr. Lake's innocence," said Little with the New York City-based firm of Hughes, Hubbard & Reed. "(But) it would be a huge loss to me financially and individually."

Hoxie getting new cafe

A familiar sports theme and colors of red and black are being used to showcase a new restaurant which will open in downtown Hoxie June 16.  
Casey and Wes Bainter will open Indian Country Café in the building they purchased from Kirk and Jana Getz, a building which for decades housed Getz IGA and The Shortstop.  
Kirk Getz plans to stay on as one of the cooks for the new business which will have the Hoxie High Indians' red and black colors on plates and in decorations.  
"We wanted to use something that pertains to Hoxie," Casey Bainter said.  
Bainter said Hoxie Indian memorabilia and Hoxie High School items such as old trophies, photos, letter jackets and yearbooks will be the predominate decoration.  
Anyone willing to donate their high school items can contact Bainter at (785) 675-3297. Located in its same location at 1017 Sheridan Ave., The Shortstop, which will be called the Indian Country Café Coffee Shop, will still offer its customers their favorite breakfast, sandwich or meal.  
"It's basically run the same, but it will have a bigger selection,"

The Shortstop will continue to operate as before, but is being renamed the Indian County Cafe Coffee Shop.

The Indian Country Café, constructed in what used to be the grocery store in an adjoining portion of the building, will also have a breakfast menu, but it will be greatly expanded from that of the one used by the Indian County Café Coffee Shop.  
The café's menu will include an all-you-can-eat salad bar which

stretches 12-feet-long in the main dining room. While the coffee shop will continue to be a smoking establishment, the café will be smoke free. Neither business will serve alcohol.  
Bainter said Friday and Saturday nights have been designated as "steak special night."  
"We are going to try different things," she said. "If they work

we'll keep them and if they don't we'll change."  
Indian Country Café will also be home to a large meeting room the public can utilize for family reunions, receptions, or birthday parties.  
"We'll have appetizers available and the room will be provided at no charge if meals are ordered," Bainter said.
