
Weather Corner

Presentations compare evolution to creation

Scientist to breakdown dinosaurs place in history and other beginnings of life

Did dinosaurs really exist? When did they exist? Where are they now? Why is the word dinosaur not in the Bible? Were Dinosaurs on Noah's Ark?

These questions and many more will be discussed Sunday, March 16 by Dr. G. Thomas Sharp in his program "The Truth About Dinosaurs" at the Oakley High School Auditorium.

"The struggle between the theories of creation and evolution is not a scientific debate but a wrestling match between two beliefs. Neither theory is scientific but is a belief system about the past that cannot be observed nor reconstructed," Sharp said.

"Growing up I struggled with the debate of creation vs. evolution and even the 'God used evolution to bring about his creation' position. During my research I've found the seminar to be highly informative of both the creationist and the evolutionist stance. I have always enjoyed science class and the study of science, so when I find a study that doesn't just say the other side is wrong, but rather offers up valid interpretations of the evidence I like to take notice," said Thomas Annis.

"The essential difference besaurs" with a focus on the younger that creation explains all things

design requiring only a few thousand years, while evolution explains things as a result of chance and accident requiring billions of years," said. Dr. Sharp

This creation seminar will feature the extensive CTF Field Collection of Biblical history (a world class museum collection) with "Stan" the T-Rex skull (one of only a few copies in the world), a Triceratops skull, a Mammoth skull, a Saber-Tooth Tiger skull, a Tylosaur skull (the largest on record at 6 ft. long), a Pachycephalosaurus skeleton (from the only known skeleton), an Edmontosaurus Leg (the longest on record) a bison skull (the largest on record at 8 ft. wide), a Pteranodon skeleton (with a 13 ft. wingspan), and much more! Doors open at 5:30 p.m. each night for those wanting to get an up close look.

In "The Truth about Dinosaurs" presentation Sharp describes each piece and presents viewers with much evidence that is not often found in textbooks or on public television. After describing each piece Sharp then addresses the five most commonly asked questions about dinosaurs and how they relate to the Bible.

"Much of what is in text books

as the result of divine and orderly entists the talk is different, more towards proof of creation," Sharp said.

Sharp also shares about Java man, Nebraska man and Piltdown man. As taught in a typical public high school science class it was from these fine people today's human evolved. Sharp discusses why these were either hoaxes or

misidentified fossils. The Creation Truth Foundation, Inc. was founded in 1989 by Sharp to foster a return in complete faith and practice to the biblical foundation. Sharp has been a science educator since 1964 teaching from seventh grade to graduate level. He earned a bachelor's degree from Purdue University, a master's degree from the University of Oklahoma and a doctorate from South Florida Theological Seminary.
