
Carey is a graduate of Fredonia High School and graduated from Cotty College in Nevada, Mo., and St. Mary University in Leavenworth.

Traveling abroad requires a little more planning than domestic travel, but believe me, it's worth your time. Here are a few steps to help you travel with less stress:




