Crossword puzzles, Cryptoquips, and word scrambles are just a few of the popular puzzles types in the newspapers. There are people that faithfully do their crossword every day. A relatively new phenomenon is the Sudoku puzzle, which became an international hit in 2005.

Sudoku is a logic-based number placement puzzle. Sudoku puzzles are a type of Latin square. A Latin square is a table filled with different symbols in such a way that each symbol occurs exactly once each column. The modern puzzle was invented by an American architect, Howard Garns, in 1979 and published by Dell Magazines under the name "Number Place." The puzzles became popular in Japan in 1986. Sudoku is an abbreviation of the Japanese phrase "Suji wa dokushin ni kagiru," meaning "the numbers must be single," or "the numbers must occur only once." The name is a trademark of puzzle publisher Nikoli Co. Ltd.

Nitrogen timing key

are still some wheat fields that haven't been topdressed with nitrogen. Some of those fields are starting to turn yellow and appear to be nitrogen deficient, said Dave Mengel, K-State Research and Extension soil fertility specialist.

That may prompt the question, Mengel said, "How late can nitrogen be applied on wheat and still pay, particularly with the price of nitrogen so high?"

"Research from K-State and other universities has shown that nitrogen-deficient wheat will almost always respond to additional nitrogen fertilizer by increasing

MANHATTAN — With the wet yield and protein content — as spring in parts of the state, there long as the nitrogen is applied before flag leaf emergence," Mengel said. "But once the wheat heads, producers are unlikely to receive an economic yield benefit from applying nitrogen, even if the wheat is nitrogen deficient.'
