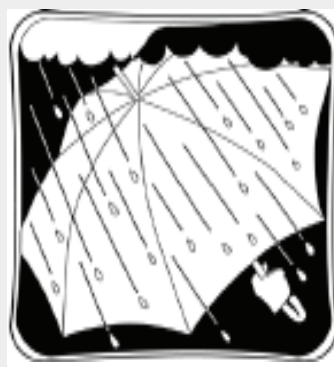


## Weather Corner



**Tonight...**Mostly cloudy. A chance of thunderstorms. Some thunderstorms may be severe with large hail in the evening. Lows in the upper 50s. Northeast winds 10 to 20 mph shifting to the north 10 to 15 mph after midnight. Chance of thunderstorms 40 percent.

**Thursday...**Partly sunny. Not as warm. A slight chance of light rain showers in the morning...Then a chance of light rain showers and isolated thunderstorms in the afternoon. Highs 70 to 75. Northwest winds 10 to 15 mph. Chance of precipitation 50 percent. Thursday night...Mostly cloudy. A 20 percent chance of thunderstorms in the evening. Lows in the lower 50s. Northwest winds 10 to 15 mph.

**Friday...**Mostly sunny. Warmer. Highs in the lower 80s. West winds 10 to 15 mph. Friday night...Partly cloudy. Lows in the mid 50s.

**Saturday and Saturday night...**Mostly clear. Warmer. Highs in the mid 90s. Lows around 60.

# Annual tractor show rolls through Selden

Selden hosted the 15th annual antique car and tractor show on Sunday. About 70 cars and tractors along with a large number of small engines were on display. Hundreds of spectators came out to enjoy the exhibits and a day filled with fun and games.

The Selden CYO served a lunch of pulled pork, hot dogs, and hamburgers to the crowd. This was the first year the CYO served the meal. Throughout the meal and into the afternoon, Rose Bainter Joe Bainter, Elaine Milky and friends entertained diners in the park while the Old Time Band from the Hoxie area entertained crowds in the parish hall. There were a variety of craft and vendor booths in the hall and outside in and around the park.

Early in the day, a **basketball free throw** contest was held for students in grades 3-8. If the 3-4-5 division, Koi Wessel won first place while his brother Kade Wessel grabbed second. Tad Holm finished third out of the contestants. In the 6-7-8 division, Hailee Spresser captured first followed by Jeff Shaw (2<sup>nd</sup>) and Kain Priess (3<sup>rd</sup>). The Selden Lions club once again hosted the **pedal tractor pull** competition with a large group of participants in each age division ready to test their strength and skill against the sled.
