Lady Trojan gets All-American

After Colby Community College sophomore designated hitter Ninostka Amaro wasn't named to the Jayhawk All-Conference First Team earlier this spring, Lady Trojan head coach Ryan Sturdy admitted to having his doubts as to whether she would be named to an All-American team.

Little did Sturdy know, he had nothing to worry about.

Not only did Colby's all-time home run leader and the nation's leading home run hitter this season make an All-American team, she was named a Division I NJ-CAA First Team All-American by the National Fastpitch Coaches Association, becoming the first player in the 23-year history of the Trojan softball program to receive that honor.

"I was a little concerned, but I knew she had good enough numbers to earn her the respect of other coaches in the region and in the conference," said Sturdy. "I thought she should have gotten other awards, but this is a welldeserved honor."

Amaro hit .434 with 27 home runs and 72 RBIs and finished her career with 40 home runs—the most in school history. She also went 10-9 in the circle for the Lady Trojans, who finished 30-32.

Amaro joins Heather Ebert (2004), Lynette Bohannon (2000), Kara Brown (1991), Dana Reep (1991) and Jolene Ricard (1990) as the only All-Americans in Lady Trojan softball history. Ebert's Second-Team All-American honor was the highest for any Colby player prior to Amaro this year.

Even though Amaro didn't make First-Team All Conference, she was eligible for the NFCA All-American honor after being selected First Team All-Region at the end of May.

Amaro was the only player in the Jayhawk Conference to make the first team. Garden City's Rebecca Diehl was on the second team along with Butler County's Gabrielle Hart.

The NFCA and NJCAA each select their own national junior college All-American teams.

Amaro wasn't named to the NJCAA All-American Team, but Sturdy says that had more to do with the team's sub-.500 record.

"She was up against five other kids and she fell a little bit short because the team didn't finish as well," said Sturdy. "She had it just on statistics, but there's other factors that coaches look at to determine who gets in the spots."

Sturdy said he notified Amaro via e-mail of her recognition on the NFCA team. Amaro is back in her native Puerto Rico playing for the Puerto Rican National softball

Amaro is still unsure of her next collegiate destination. She is talking with Division I Bethune-Cookman and Sturdy said if she didn't go there, she would go to a Division II school in Texas to play her final two years.

Amaro's two-year stint at Colby now ranks among the best ever, and Sturdy hopes her success will help attract others like her to his program in the coming years.

"I would like to think this would help, because it's a fairly big honor," said Sturdy.

"We've established a great academic tradition. For the last 10 years we've been above a 3.0 in team GPA, and eight of the last 10 years we've been in the top six in the nation. This can be the same type of deal. If we can establish getting kids on that All-Region First Team, it will show other kids the type of players we're trying to bring in."
