Answers

1. **False.** That could get you into big trouble, because doing it is likely to create anxiety, and is likely to be viewed as rude or an aggressive challenge.

2. **True.** Actually, an expression of anger is far more likely to get attention. The angry face is the one that will stand out in a crowd.

3. **False.** Not always. Studies have revealed that the one emotion men read better and more quickly than women is anger. Perhaps this is because even in the earliest human history, the potential for physical threat was greater from a male than from a female. This may have been a survival mechanism.

4. **True.** The right side and the left side of a face are almost never the same. According to psychologist Werner Wolff of Columbia University, the right side is the public face, the left the private face.

5. **False.** In many places in the world, people stare at strangers without meaning to be rude. Arabs often look other males in the

eye with such an intensity when talking that it makes Americans uncomfortable.

6. **False.** Beards and hairstyles still make a statement, unless the man's in the military or a profession with strict rules regarding the two. The length of a man's hair may say he's a rebel or a nonconformist. Males often grow beards to make them look younger, older or simply more male.

7. **False.** It could simply be an indication that the person is pleased with life, satisfied or has a positive approach, not because he or she is a narcissist.

College students aren't the only ones who have experienced what I call that awful, lingering smell that tells! It can make the microwave and room stink to high heaven! Here's the remedy: Fill a large (at least 4-cup) microwave-safe bowl with 1 cup water and sprinkle in your favorite spice — like cloves or cinnamon — several drops of vanilla extract or 1/4 cup white household vinegar. Bring to a boil. Let it sit inside the microwave for 10 to 15 minutes to allow it to cool down. (Don't open the door early!) Then wipe the

walls down with paper towels. Leave the door open to further air it out.

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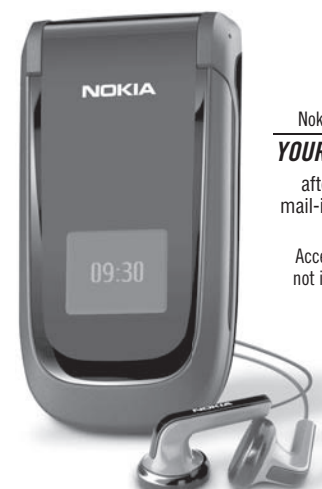
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
