For declarer, the bottom line on almost every deal is to make the contract. To this end, any play -- no matter how unusual -- that enhances his prospects of making what he has bid is a good one. Conversely, any play -- even though seemingly normal -- that jeopardizes the contract is

Today's hand provides a classic illustration of this principle. After West's opening diamond lead, South held up his ace until the third round of the suit, East discarding a heart on the third diamond after dummy discarded a spade. Declarer then cashed the A-K of clubs, discovering to his dismay that West had started with the J-9-6-4 of clubs.

Since South could not afford to concede a trick to West's jack of clubs, he turned his attention to hearts. But when that suit failed to divide favorably, he could do no better than take the eight top tricks he had started with.

Although declarer admittedly ran into unlucky suit breaks during the play, he had no one but himself to blame for the outcome. The fact is that after the first three tricks had been played, he was virtually certain to make three notrump if he took the steps necessary to guarantee the contract.

The proper line of play after winning the third diamond is to cash one high club, cross to the king of hearts and lead a second club. After West follows low, dummy's ten is finessed.

In the actual case, the finesse succeeds, and declarer finishes with two overtricks, scoring six clubs, three hearts, a spade and a diamond.

And what happens if the finesse loses? In that case, declarer would wind up with 10 tricks instead of 11, but would feel secure in the knowledge that, win or lose, the finesse assured him of making the contract. And that, as we said before, is the bottom line.
