**Missouri mayors teaming up on legislative issues**

JEFFERSON CITY, Mo. (AP) — The mayors of Missouri's largest cities are coming together in an attempt to gain clout at the state Capitol.  
 The mayors of St. Louis, Kansas City, Springfield, Columbia, St. Joseph, Joplin and Jefferson City met behind closed doors Tuesday in the capital city. Also at the meeting was the St. Louis County executive.  
 Their mission: to develop a unified agenda to press in the Missouri Legislature.  
 The local leaders outlined three general priorities Tuesday: protecting municipal control against state efforts to intercede; seeking more money for city transit; and focusing on work force development, which could range from early childhood education to prisoner-release programs and economic development issues.  
 The cities each already have their own Capitol lobbyists, and they already team up with numerous smaller cities through the Missouri Municipal League, which also has its own Capitol lobbyists. But the cities' interests don't always coincide.  
 Kansas City Mayor Mark Funkhouser initiated the mayoral meeting.  
 As a relatively new mayor elected last year, Funkhouser said: "It seemed to me, looking at it from the outside, that there was way too much competition between St. Louis and Kansas City."  
 Added Funkhouser: "Today was a real solid start" toward building

**Kansas college president offends some with letter**

TOPEKA (AP) — Some Washburn University regents are criticizing its president over a letter he sent on official stationery asking a judge to give an accused sex offender probation instead of prison.  
 Three of Washburn's nine regents told The Topeka Capital-Journal that they consider President Jerry Farley's letter inappropriate, and the Board of Regents' chairman said the matter would be discussed further.  
 "I think it's probably a letter at

this point he rather would not have sent and probably regrets," said Topeka Mayor Bill Bunten, one of the regents. Farley defended his actions, saying the letter was

"an act of compassion, an act of kindness and an act of friendship" to a university employee married whose husband pleaded no contest to aggravated indecent solicitation

of a child younger than 14. He signed it, "Jerry B. Farley, President."  
 "It certainly wasn't any indication nor would I have implied in any way that I was speaking for Washburn University," Farley said. "Not at all. It was purely personal."  
 Farley sent the letter on May 19 to a Wabaunsee County district judge on behalf of Richard Blevins, a former state arson investigator. Blevins' wife is a secretary to Farley. The judge sentenced Blevins to 32 months in prison. In the letter, Farley said he had known Blevins for more than 10 years and that the "highly public and humiliating exposure of the allegations has had a very punishing effect on Richard."  
 Regent Dan Lykins said it would have been better for Farley to put the letter on personal stationery.  
 "It's not something the board of regents of Washburn would do," Lykins said.  
 And regent Maggie Warren said: "I generally believe it was inappropriate, the manner in which it was handled by Dr. Farley."  
 But Farley said he doesn't think sending the letter on personal stationery would have made a difference.  
 "It is probably impossible to separate me from the title and position that I own," he said. "Everything I do is basically in the public venue."

**Child Passenger Safety Week begins Sunday**

Safe Kids Kansas urges parents and caregivers to make sure their child safety seats are properly installed in their vehicles. Certified child passenger safety technicians will be available to provide hands-on instruction on how to use and properly install child safety seats at local Safe Kids events across Kansas during Child Passenger Safety Week, September 20-27. Safe Kids Coalitions also hold regular check up events and fitting stations throughout the year.

In the last eight years, a total of 47,246 child safety seats have been checked at 1,915 local check up events in Kansas.

 "It's the responsibility of every parent and caregiver to make sure their children are safely restrained — every trip, every time," said Jan Stegelman, Safe Kids Kansas Coordinator.  
 "We are urging everyone to get their child safety seats inspected. When it comes to the safety of a child, there is no room for mistakes." A recent study found that car seat checkups provided by Safe Kids coalitions have been very effective in teaching parents important safety skills.  
 In addition to community check-up events, Safe Kids Kansas Coalitions have provided 23,427 child safety seats and booster seats to low-income families in our state.  
 According to National Highway Traffic Safety Administration (NHTSA) research, 8,325 lives of children under age 5 have been saved nationally by the proper use of child restraints during the past 30 years.  
 In 2006 alone, an estimated 425 lives of children under age 5 were saved by child restraint use.  
 According to Stegelman, parents and caregivers should follow a few basic guidelines for determining which restraint system is best suited to protect their children in a vehicle:  
 1. For the best possible protection keep infants in the back seat

of the vehicle, in a rear-facing child safety seat, as long as possible — up to the maximum weight or height limit of the particular seat. At a minimum, keep infants rear facing until at least age 1 and at least 20 pounds. Be sure to read and follow your child safety seat owner's manual for correct usage and weight/height limitations.  
 2. When children outgrow their rear-facing seats, they should ride in a forward-facing child safety seat, in the back seat of the vehicle, until they reach the upper weight or height limit of the harness of the particular seat.  
 3. Once children outgrow their forward-facing harnessed seats (usually around age 4 and 40 or more pounds, depending upon the specific car seat) they should ride in booster seats, seated in the back seat of the vehicle, until the vehicle seat belts fit properly. Kansas Law states children must remain in a booster seat until the child reaches 8-years-old, 80 pounds, or 4'9" in height.  
 4. After children fully outgrow their booster seats, they should use the adult seat belts in the back seat of the vehicle. Seat belts fit properly when the lap belt lays across the upper thighs (staying off of the soft abdomen) and the shoulder belt rests on the shoulder or col-

lars. The child's legs should also bend naturally over the edge of the vehicle seat so as to discourage slouching, which can cause poor seat belt fit. This milestone usually occurs when the child is

between 8 and 12 years old, is approximately 4'9" tall, and weighs between 80 to 100 pounds. Children should remain in the back seat position of the vehicle until at least age 13 for maximum safety.
