Wildcats player charged with abuse

Kansas State junior running back Leon Patton was dismissed from the team on Friday, a day after Riley County Police arrested him on charges of child abuse of a 4-month-old.

Patton, 20, was arrested and more — second best on the team. jailed on \$30,000 bond in a July A police news release said the victim was a 4-month-old boy but offered no other details.

Calls to Riley County Police Department spokesman Lt. Kurt Moldrup was not immediately returned Friday.

Patton was already on probation after an early July traffic stop led to the discovery of two outstanding warrants. He was issued a citation for driving with a suspended check found outstanding warrants for theft of two video games at Wal-Mart in Pottawatomie County in 2007 and a failure-to-appear charge on an unpaid parking ticket in Manhattan, Kan.

announced Patton's dismissal from the team through a news release, which said no further comments would be made because a formal investigation was under way.
