Sena had 34 set assists for the night. Da Silva had 12 kills and 11 and digs and sophomore Rexanne Schilowsky had 6 kills, 3 service aces and 2 blocks. Freshman LeAnna Shaeffer had 9 kills.

The team is now 11-20 overall with a 1-5 record in their conference.

Cleaves has career averages of 3.6 points and 1.9 assists in 167 games with Detroit, Sacramento, Cleveland and Seattle.




Fazekas, a Colorado native, averaged 4.1 points and 3.4 rebounds in 26 games with Dallas and the L.A. Clippers last year, his rookie


