For the Colby High boys basketball team Tuesday, it was a case of so close and yet so far. After mounting a fierce rally that erased a 13-point deficit, the Eagles fell to the Hays Indians 58-56 at the Community Building.


Even though his team was unable to pick up a win, Jasper was still happy with the effort.

"They played hard and never quit," he said.


The Lady Trojans will play again at on Thursday in Scotts-38-30 at halftime due to some bluff, Neb., against the Commu-Classic.


