# Guard scores 26; Wildcats win easily

MANHATTAN (AP) — Strong defensive play has been Kansas State's signature this season.

Teams are averaging just 60.5 points against Kansas State (11-3) on 38.3 percent shooting.

The Wildcats' defense was again stellar in a 99-68 win over Chicago State on Monday night.

"We did what we've done all year," said Kansas State head coach Frank Martin. "We've done a pretty good job of sticking to our game plan to eliminate the guys on the other team who we're trying to take out of the game."

Fred Brown led all scorers with a career-high 26 points. Darren Kent had 13 points and 12 rebounds the fourth double-double of his career — and Jacob Pullen added 12 points for the Wildcats, who had six players in double figures in their final nonconference game of the season.

"I was just feeling it tonight and they were falling, so I just kept shooting," said Brown, who topped his previous best of 25 points against Xavier last season.
