Use Lent to prepare

Wednesday, which opens the season of Lent in the church year, will be next week. and it occurred to me that this would now be a good opportunity to review some thoughts about Lent.

On the church calendar,

Lent is the 40-day period before Easter. (The 40 days do not include Sundays in the count.) It is a time used to prepare our hearts for Easter. We use this time to reflect upon our need for a Savior, and to reconsider the cost of our gift of salvation in Jesus Christ.

Why 40 days? In Scripture, 40 days usually references a time of trial, a time of testing and a time of spiritual preparation. Generally, the period leads to a new beginning. Noah and his family were on the ark for 40 days. Moses was on Mount Sinai to receive the 10 Commandments for 40 days. Jesus was tempted for 40 days.

Lent is a time of spiritual preparation for an intense focus on the suffering, death and resurrection of Jesus. The last week of Lent is also called Holy Week. This period brings us in touch with the last days of Christ's earthly journey.

On Palm Sunday, we walk with Jesus into Jerusalem. On Maundy Thursday, the Church shares in the






