Eagles rally to defeat Smoky Valley

The Colby High boys needed a second-half rally to defeat Smoky Valley on Monday in the first round of the substate tournament, erasing a 4-point half-time deficit on their way to picking up a 52-47 victory.

In a game played at the Community Building, Senior Levi Schlick caught a tough lob pass from senior Cade Carter with one hand and layed it off the glass for two points to give Colby an early lead. Senior Corey Sager knocked down a mid-range jumper to increase the Eagles' lead to 6-0 with 4:38 left in the first quarter.

Chase Dippel of Smoky Valley hit a three from the left baseline to cut Colby's lead to 6-3. Dippel would be a thorn in the Eagles' side throughout the night.

Schlick knocked down a tough

in the quarter. The Vikings edged their way back into the game, though, and trailed 11-10 at the end of the first quarter. The Lindsborg squad took the

lead early in the second quarter when Dippel hit a long three to put the Vikings out front 13-11.

Colby got a little careless with the ball in the second quarter and made some ill-advised passes that led to turnovers. A combination of the Eagles' sloppy play and Dippel's lights-out shooting helped the Vikings gain an 18-15 lead.

Sager drained a mid-range jumper from the top of the key to cut Smoky Valley's lead to one. Erick Harding of Lindsborg launched a shot from way beyond the threepoint line that banked off the glass and fell through the basket as the buzzer sounded to announce the end of the half. The heave gave

the Vikings a 24-20 lead.

The Colby High girls' basketball season came to an end Wednesday as the Lady Eagles lost to Hesston 47-40 in the first round of their substate at Russell High School.

It was a tough way to end what had been a solid season for a young team, but the girls should only get better with age.

The Lady Swathers jumped out to a 7-0 lead to start the first quarter. Colby sophomore Katherine Kaus knocked down a threepointer to cut Hesston's lead to 7-3. Later in the game, she hit a jumper from 15 feet to cut the to bring the Lady Eagles within Hesston lead to 2. Colby tightened up its defense, holding Hesston scoreless during the last four minutes of the quarter, and the Lady Eagles trailed 7-5.

Kaus hit another jump shot to tie the game at the beginning of the second quarter. Then the momentum shifted back to the Lady Swathers as they gained a 17-10 advantage. Colby responded by scoring the next five points and cutting Hesston's lead to 2. The Lady Swathers led 19-15 at the half.

Sophomore Shelby Terrell buried a jumper to cut lead to 29-25 early in the fourth quarter. Kaus fouled out with 6:45 left.


