For all the reasons Kansas State was bypassed by the NCAA's selection committee, none stands out more than the simplest: The Wildcats didn't win enough games. Not during a tough three-game stretch in nonconference, not at the start of the Big 12 season, not at last week's conference tournament.

Win a few more of those games and Kansas State would be headed to somewhere like Boise or Minneapolis for the NCAA tournament instead of hosting Illinois State in the first round of the NIT on Wednesday.

The Wildcats did win 21 games, finished tied for fourth in the Big 12 at 9-7. They hoped it would be enough to get into the NCAA tournament for the second straight

Instead, Kansas State is headed to the NIT for the second time in three years.


