Be savvy about offers

MANHATTAN – Most workers look forward to retirement, but assume they will decide when that day will be. In today's struggling economy, however, some employers are suggesting now would be a good time.

Some are offering retirement incentive programs to employees to cut payroll costs and help balance company budgets.

Iowa State University Extension family resource management specialist Barb Wollan outlined the following major steps to take when making a decision about an early retirement offer:

- Read and listen carefully.
- Gather information.

• Evaluate the options critically. As part of that, find out:

• Is the offer really optional? If you decline, what would your future with the employer be like?

• Will you have group health insurance? If so, who will pay?

• Will you need to get a job to fill the income gap?

• Do you have options on how to receive the pension payout?

Wollan said workers also should consider their retirement goals and whether the offer is compatible with those before responding.

"Avoid responding before assessing your own situation," she urged.

Extension Services across the nation - including K-State Research and Extension – have tools and resources that can help workers make informed financial decisions, Wollan said.


