Auto dealer, lawn service renovated

MC Auto Outlet has recently finished renovating its building, adding some office space and sprucing up the former restaurant to serve a growing trade.

Co-owner C.W. Cheney said the used-car business opened at 855 Davis Ave., just east of Range Ave. and Montana Mike's, in October 2005. The building had been occupied by Long John Silvers, a fast-food restaurant, and by a Mexican restaurant and a barbecue place, among others.

Krohn Carpentry, an area contractor, renovated the building, Cheney said, starting in mid-November and finishing in January. He said the building was remodeled, but didn't increase in size.

"We turned an eating establishment into an office building," he said, adding that the firm has expanded quite a bit since coming to the city.

"We grew," he said. "We have added a detail man and a salesman."

Scott Harrison is the company's detail guy, reconditioning cars. Scott King is sales person, Cheney said, and the business has also added four part-time workers.

Harrison was hired in November 2005 and King in June 2006, said Cheney.

Cheney said when the business first opened, it had just two employees, him and co-owner Jason Mader; and 10 used cars in the parking lot. He said they have 50 cars on the lot today.

MC specializes in selling used cars, Cheney said. Most have barely been used, with usually less than 36,000 miles on them.

They buy most of their vehicles at St. Louis and Kansas City auctions, he said.

Clarification


