these investments had been good for the college.

"The dorms were built to revitalize the campus," said Black.

The college needs to be innovative and use creative ways to continue to grow, she said. Board members need to go to meetings prepared with a wealth of informations so they can make good decisions.

Black said students should be board's No. 1 priority. She said the college needs to maintain faculty, move forward on technology, be open with the community and do everything in its power to continue to strive for excellence.

Kenton K. Krehbiel, Colby postmaster, said the college needs to continue to implement innovative programs to keep growing. He said the new dormitories were the best way to get the college to continue to grow.






