MRI imaging truck turns off the lights

Much of central Colby had a straightened the pole. brief power blackout Tuesday morning when the driver of an crew accidentally shut down a cir-MRI imaging truck at Colby Medical and Surgical Center on South Range misjudged his distance from a power pole as he was backing the long trailer into position.

The truck driver accidentally maneuvered the cab of his truck so close to the pole that it was impossible to move the rig until city crews killed the power and

The city crew made quick work of the job and the clinic was ready for work when the afternoon appointment schedule began.

In the quest for safety, the line cuit which caused power to go off in other areas of the city just after 11:15 a.m.


Gordon Gilbert, a city electric department employee, said it shut down power from Sterling (near the city shop) on the west to Country Club, and from the Union Pacific Railroad tracks by the sale barn, north to Brookside. Power was restored after about 5 minutes. Some other areas experienced a shorter outage, Gilbert said.

Gilbert said the power was off for about an hour and a quarter along Cleveland, around the clinic. People's State Bank, mostly from Range and Cleveland to Ash.

"There were no broken wires", Gilbert said, "and the pole was not broken ... however it did break the three-phase meter."

The incident was deemed an accident. The driver of the truck said he had no comment.


