

"Jennifer is always prepared," said Munderloh. "She considers the needs of the students, researching locally how they can best be served and creating curriculum and lesson plans that are unique to the group to be served.

"Jen put together awesome plans for GED intensive classes including grammar and essay writing. During her first session in Hays, all of her students successfully passed the writing portions of the GED. Through her teaching, the program saw significant growth in outcomes."

While working in Colby, Sorenson acted on suggestions from the local advisory council and planned her classes to target specific areas. She developed a money-management class focusing on balancing and budgeting personal income. She developed a combined money management and employability seminar primarily targeting a community halfway house group where residents has asked for help with job skills and creating a working budget. She incorporated technology checklists as the men searched the Internet for job opportunities, developed resumes and cover letters and created spending logs and budgets.

Student group honored



In addition to winning the Chapter Excellence Award, the Colby group won first place in the State Banner competition for the second year in a row and won the Web Site Award.




